## **Leaf Placemats**

Option 1: Wax Paper Leaf Placemat



Skills:

Counting, measuring, cutting

Materials:

Leaves (try to find colorful leaves that are still on the tree and are not wet)

Wax paper

Old t-shirt

Iron

## Directions:

- 1. To make one placemat, gather 5-10 leaves.
- 2. Measure the wax paper. You need two pieces of wax paper that are each 12 inches x 18 inches.
- 3. Cut two pieces of wax paper.
- 4. Put leaves on one piece of wax paper in any design that you wish.

- 5. Cover with another piece of wax paper.
- 6. Cover placemat with an old t-shirt.
- 7. Iron the placemat until the wax paper melts, about 2 minutes.
- 8. To make multiple placemats, repeat the previous steps.
- 9. Enjoy!

Option 2: Leaf Rubbing Placemat



Skills:

Coloring

Materials:

Leaves (not too dry)

Crayons

8 ½ x 11 inch white paper

Contact paper (optional)

## Directions:

- 1. Collect leaves.
- 2. Select crayons in fall colors.
- 3. Remove paper wrappers from crayons.
- 4. Place the leaves under the paper.

- 5. Use the side of the crayon to color over one leaf.
- 6. Choose another color and use the side of the crayon to color over the next leaf.
- 7. Repeat until your placemat is full.
- 8. If you want to "laminate" your placemat, use contact paper to cover the paper. Leave a small border and cut around the placemat.
- 9. To make additional placemats, go back to step 4 and repeat.
- 10. Enjoy!
